

**CITY OF MACCLENNY**  
**Regular Meeting**  
**March 11, 2014**  
**6:00 p.m.**

The City Commission met in a regular session, Tuesday, March 11, 2014 with the following present: Mayor Gary Dopson, City Manager Phil Rhoden, Commissioners Floyd V. Bennett, Sam Kitching, Mark Bryant, and Cecil Horne Jr.

Mayor Dopson called the meeting to order. Commissioner Kitching opened the meeting with prayer, followed by a pledge to the United States Flag.

In old business, City Manager Phil Rhoden stated the information provided by Rock Rhoden and the City staff is not comparable across the board, and asked for it to be tabled for another 30 days and let our Attorney and City Engineer look at the information gathered.

City Engineer Frank Darabi spoke regarding duplexes and their fees. Mayor Dopson stated he might need Mr. Darabi to come back for the next meeting.

Mayor Dopson recognized City Attorney Frank Maloney to read Ordinance 14-06 by title only. A bill to be entitled an ordinance relating to annexation; providing for the annexation of certain lands contiguous to the City of Macclenny; providing for acceptance of a voluntary annexation request from James and Teresa Donovan of parcel 31-2S-22-0021-0004-0040. Commissioner Kitching made a motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance 14-06 and was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. Voting was unanimous.


A review of the Educational Reimbursement Agreement to be included in the personnel policy for volunteer firefighters to sign making them responsible for training and education expenses if they left the City before so many volunteer hours were completed. Commissioner Kitching made a motion to approve this agreement upon City Attorney's approval and was seconded by Commissioner Bennett.

In other business was approval of the Minutes from the month of February. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes and was seconded by Commissioner Kitching. Voting was unanimous.


In other business was the review of the bills for February. Motion to approve the February bills was made by Commissioner Bennett and was seconded by Commissioner Kitching. Voting was unanimous.

City Manager Phil Rhoden spoke about how well the Book Fair went at Heritage Park with all proceeds going to the School. The Farmer's Market will be open at Heritage Park the first Saturday of each month beginning April. The City will be partnering with the Baker County School District and their vocational training program. This will be a part of the Adult Education Program.

With no further comments from the audience, Mayor Dopson adjourned the regular meeting.
